The course will be based on the latest York Course, called **Superstar,** using booklets which cost £3.80 as well as tapes.

27th February: Who is Jesus?

The meetings will be led by Rosemary Sumner, assisted by Tessa Carrick.

Alternatively, if you would like to follow a Lent Course on your own, Tessa has booklets from USPG Living with a World of Difference.

2020 Adult Confirmation Course: Stepping out of the Boat - together

There will be an adult confirmation group taking place between now and Easter.

Note for everyone: Whilst the course is being organised primarily for the benefit of adults not yet confirmed (or baptised), it is open to anyone who wishes to enjoy and benefit from a reminder of the basics of our faith and church.

There are six sessions on Saturday afternoons at 2.00 pm, lasting for 90 minutes. Each session will take a particular topic and begin to explore it together.

Actually to be confirmed, you must attend 5 of the 6 sessions. The venue is to be arranged.

Week 1 - January 25th The Trinity: God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit - 3 ways of knowing God.

Week 2 - February 8th The Bible: The story of God's relationship with the world.

Week 3 - February 22 Prayer and spirituality: How to listen to God and how God listens to us.

Week 4 - March 7th Worship in church and the world.

Week 5 - March 21st The Church, Sacraments, History and Tradition.

Week 6 - April 4th The Christian Life and preparing for the Confirmation Service.

TO SIGN UP FOR THIS COURSE PLEASE SPEAK TO REV. DAVID FORD DIRECT OR BY TELEPHONE.

WHAT IS CONFIRMATION?

- An opportunity to declare publicly your faith in God and your commitment to try to live as a disciple of Jesus.
- Another step on your faith journey.
- By being confirmed you will be able to receive Holy Communion.

WHAT IS A CONFIRMATION COURSE?

An opportunity to explore your faith with others in a safe place.

DO I NEED TO ATTEND EVERY WEEK?

There are six sessions and a rehearsal before the service. You need to attend a minimum of five sessions (one of which must be the final session) and the rehearsal.

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING TO EACH SESSION?

Nothing but yourself, an open mind and heart and lots of questions. If needed Bibles will be provided.

WHAT HAPPENS AT A CONFIRMATION SERVICE?

- Confirmation candidates affirm their faith in the baptismal promises that were originally made on your behalf by parents and godparents at your baptism.
- The Bishop lays his hands on your head and we pray that you will receive the power of the holy Spirit to live in accordance with God's will for you.

WHEN IS THE CONFIRMATION SERVICE?

We are hoping for a Confirmation Service at All Saints but if this isn't possible then we will be attending the Confirmation Service at the Cathedral on Easter Eve, Saturday 11th April.

DO I NEED TO WEAR SPECIAL CLOTHES?

Wear what you normally wear to go to church.

WILL MY FRIENDS AND FAMILY BE ABLE TO ATTEND?

I hope you will be supported by as many of your friends and family as can come on the day!
